



# Preschool 2020 - 2021 (Ages 3-5)

## Preschool

The Zion Park District will follow guidelines outlined by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Development (DCEO) during Phase 4 of the Restore Illinois Plan to provide a safe and healthy preschool experience for families. Our staff is working diligently to make adaptations to our preschool, as well as preparing extensive orientation and training for preschool staff.

## Phase 4 Preschool Modifications:

### Parent Information:

- Registration will be done by first come first serve. (10 children maximum)
- Registration fee is \$168 per month/Resident & \$178 per month/Non-Resident.
- Upon payment of preschool registration an informational packet will be given to parents. Please fill out all forms.
- All registration paper work must be completed and turned in before the first day of preschool.
- Children and staff must wear face mask inside.
- No snack or drink will be served in the classroom.
- No outside toys allowed in classroom.
- Personal belongings will be stored 6ft apart.
- All equipment will be sanitized after use.
- Children will get their own supplies of pencils, crayons, markers, scissors, glue, etc.

### Student Drop-Off & Pick-Up:

- Preschool staff will be completing a Health Assessment form at time of drop off. Please allow extra time for this process and follow park district directions when entering and exiting the parking lot.
- Parents will not be able to enter the building at any time. Drop off and pick up will take place outside at the doors.
- Preschoolers will be required to wash hands before entering the classroom.
- If a child is exhibiting any symptoms of the virus they will not be allowed at preschool.

### COVID-19 Precautions:

- Is child running a fever?
- Is anyone in your household displaying any symptoms of COVID-19?
- Have you or anyone in your household come into close contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19?
- If child runs a fever of 100 or higher:

Participants cannot return to program until fever free for 24 hours without medication.

Families will be notified if child tests positive for COVID-19 and the Lake County Health Department will be notified and guidance from the agencies will determine if program must close.
